

Growth in Christlikeness

What does Paul mean in Romans 8:5 and following about setting our minds on the things of the flesh versus things of the spirit? (Rom 8:5 NKJV - "For those who live according to the flesh set their minds on the things of the flesh, but those [who live] according to the Spirit, the things of the Spirit.")

It seems that part of what he is getting at is that we set our minds on the things of the flesh when we seek to please God by doing things out of our own strength. For example, I might think to myself "I'm going to work really hard and memorize this chapter in the Bible. That will make God love me more and overlook some of my sins." Or perhaps we strive to serve others by our own strength (and our own thoughts and plans) and forget to include God. Rather I need to have my mind set on Christ and seek His direction and strength.



Accomplishments at the Cross By Dennis Finley

We will consider what all was accomplished at the cross. This cross was intended by the authorities to inflict maximum atrocities and torture of the intended victim. It was an example of extreme cruelty, brutality and awfulness on the person. It humiliated the one in the most humiliating way. Overwhelming suffering was the point.

Now the cross of Christ is a cherished symbol of the Christian faith, joyfully worn and exhibited by believers everywhere. Today it is a symbol of victory. Here are some things accomplished at the cross (very partial list):

Genesis 3:15: Fulfillment of prophecy; Psalm 22: fulfillment of prophecy, scoffing, physical suffering, piercing of hands and feet, dividing of garments; Isaiah 53: fulfillment of many prophecies, despised and forsaken by men, Christ bore our sorrows and our grief, pierced through, iniquity of all on Him, quiet in His torture, like a slaughtered lamb, cut off, isolated; Luke 22:7: Metaphor of a sacrificial lamb; I Corinthians 1:18: Demonstrated the folly of non-believers and the power of God; I Corinthians 10:16: Sharing in the blood and body of Christ.

"When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, 'Put out into deep water, and let down the nets for a catch." Luke 5:4

"There are few things I enjoy more than going fishing. I especially enjoy actually catching a few trout in Colorado. There are times, however, when I am like Simon. I worked hard and haven't caught a thing... There were simply no fish where I was fishing... The problem of fishing where there are no fish is not unique to Simon and me. It is a common problem in the church as well.

I have begun to study the behavior of trout...three things determine their location. These are a place where they feel safe, where their basic needs are met & to be able to live and survive without making any undue effort.
