Evangelism

A video and study several years ago encouraged believers to take the initiative and simply "walk across the room" in order to be used by God to impact someone for Christ. Matthew 28:18-20 in part is commonly translated "Go and make disciples." The word "go" however is a participle that carries with it the meaning "as you are going."

I ask myself, as I am going, how can I influence people for Him? I suggest there are several initiatives we can take: simply take that first step to meet someone, take that first step to open a conversation about something deeper, take that first step to show genuine care and concern for someone - to meet them where they are.

Take that first step - are you willing to walk across the room (or yard) to influence someone for Him? After all, He took that first step to meet us in our need.

Senior Navigator staff and specialists in discipleship Ron and Mary Bennett

led our Fall Conference as Ron shared his thoughts about following Jesus. He noted that we look at our world through various schema or lenses. He asked if the "Gospel" is merely a set of doctrinal truths? Instead of a set of truths, Ron proposed that the Bible teaches that the Gospel is more a "who" than a "what." "The Gospel is God's story expressed through the revelation of the Lord Jesus Christ." The Gospel is a cosmic drama with the main character being Jesus (and not us!).

Secondly, he noted that a good mental image for a "disciple" today might be "apprentice." A disciple is an apprentice of Jesus and His Kingdom. Our purpose is to be an Image Bearer (2 Cor. 3:18; Romans 8:29). Our pattern for discipleship should be to be totally aligned with the character, mission, values and habits of Christ. (Luke 6:40: "A disciple is not greater than his teacher, but everyone when fully trained will be like his teacher.")

Finally our motivation for discipleship is God's iridescent love. Ron shared that the image of the light of God's love striking a prism, breaking into multiple hues is similar to the multiple ways His love works in our lives.
