Battling those Flaming Arrows by David Dennis

Paul reminds believers in Ephesians 6 about the true nature of our warfare:

Ephesians 6:10-13: (NET Bible, used by permission) "Finally, be strengthened in the Lord and in the strength of his power. Clothe yourselves with the full armor of God, so that you will be able to stand against the schemes of the devil. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the powers, against the world rulers of this darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavens. For this reason, take up the full armor of God so that you may be able to stand your ground on the evil day, and having done everything, to stand."



And in verse 16: "and in all of this, by taking up the shield of faith with which you can extinguish all the flaming arrows of the evil one."

Recently on our family vacation we had a Sunday morning worship service in our cabin with our adult children and grandchildren. We looked at this passage, focusing on verse 16. We discussed the fact that our warfare is far beyond merely flesh and blood but that it involves spiritual warfare, which involves "rulers, powers ... and world rulers of this darkness." What are some of the "flaming arrows" (other versions say "fiery darts") that Satan throws at us and what is the nature of the shield of faith that we can use to protect ourselves? Here are some examples:

Flaming Satanic Arrows	Shield of Faith defense: Do you believe this?
"It is OK to look at the answers and cheat on this test" (or taxes or contract)	Exodus 20:15 NKJV - "You shall not steal." John 8:32 NKJV - "And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free."
"I'm of no value. I can't do anything right. I'm full of shame."	John 3:16 NKJV - "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life." Romans 5:8 NKJV - "But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us."
"I'm not capable. I can't do this. I am full of anxiety."	Philippians 4:6-7 NKJV - "Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication, with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God; and the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus."
"It's OK to click on that image. I'm tired and deserve to relax."	Philippians 4:8 NKJV - "Finally, brethren, whatever things are true, whatever things [are] noble, whatever things [are] just, whatever things [are] pure, whatever things [are] lovely, whatever things [are] of good report, if [there is] any virtue and if [there is] anything praiseworthymeditate on these things."
