"I can see clearly now: Seeking first God's kingdom" was the theme and title of Dr. Don Davis's messages at our 2021 Fall Conference. The Conference was quite well-attended with nearly 100 participants.

Here are a few of the points Dr. Davis made:

- There is a "real world" of the unseen. We must see Jesus and look to Him over and over and over.
- ✦For to me to live is Christ He is not a program nor a method. He is a real person with whom we need a close relationship.
- We can offer perspectives, conviction and example to others to help them grow spiritually.
- We live in a "noisy" world today with many distractions (Covid 19, political upheaval, media/information overload,

stress, anxiety and fear). We must walk by faith and not by sight (2 Cor. 5:6-7).

- The story of Christ becomes a lens through which we see the world. Isaiah 26:3 reminds us that we can have perfect peace as our minds are focused on Christ.
