Enoch walked with God (Genesis 5:21-24)

Ray Steadman said that that walk was a walk toward righteousness (Genesis 5:21-24). G. Campell Morgan noted that a walk with God includes at least four aspects:

Walk toward righteousness Walk in agreement Walk in mutual trust Walk in step with Him

Walk toward **righteousness:** It is His righteousness, that He has granted to us. As we walk with Him progressively, we can experience His holiness. This righteousness is always by faith, despite my not "feeling righteous." This righteousness can be expected. I confidently expect that He will grand His thoughts, words and deeds throughout the day.

It is a righteousness that I can experience and realize that it came from Him, not from me. Isaiah 26:12: (NKJV): "LORD, You will establish peace for us, For You have also done all our works in us."

It is a righteousness that I can expect, can experience and one that He wants to express through me to others. That is His desire to make the living Christ visible through us.

1 Corinthians 1:30: (NKJV) "But of Him you are in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God--and righteousness and sanctification and redemption—" This wisdom is in contrast to the wisdom of the Corinthian people of that time. Godly wisdom versus worldly wisdom. That wisdom is first of all righteousness (Christ **imputed**), then sanctification (Christ **imparted**), then finally redemption (Christ **implanted**).

Psalm 17:15 NKJV "As for me, I will see Your face in righteousness; I shall be satisfied when I awake in Your likeness."

This righteousness is toward the likeness of Christ.

Walk in **agreement:** with all that God has done for us on the cross, resurrection and ascension. Agreement with all the Scripture has said

Agree with Him as the Old Man is taken down in death

Agree that there is nothing of value in me, but only in Christ. He has He given me his life, words and divine favor.

Agree with Him that all is in His hands: the past the present and the future

Walk in **mutual trust**: G. Campbell Morgan: 1Co 1:9 NKJV "God [is] faithful, by whom you were called into the fellowship of His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord." "Fellowship" = "Koinonia": having everything in common.

Resources and *Responsibility*: When we walk in mutual trust with Him it means that all of my resources are committed to fulfilling His responsibilities. Likewise all of His resources are committed to my responsibilities.

I look at my neighbors, in the church and in the business world. What are His responsibilities toward them? Redemption, love, freely accept them, seek their good no matter who they are. All of MY resources are to be placed at His disposal.

I trust His resources to meet my responsibilities and I commit my resources to meet His responsibilities.
