Session 3: Embracing Christ's Leadership and Ownership of Our Lives

Discussion Questions:

- 1. What do you understand as being the significance of "taking up your cross"? What do you understand our cross to be?
- 2. What are the consequences of taking up our cross and following Jesus? What does it "cost" us?
- I. **Take up Your Cross:** In calling people to be His committed disciples, Christ beckons his disciples to willingly submit themselves to His leadership and ownership of their lives
 - A. Christ's call to take up one's cross falls in the middle step of a threefold process- Matthew 16:24
 - Let him deny himself
 - And take up His cross
 - And follow me
 - B. Christ's call to take up one's cross involves a daily decision on the part of Christ's disciple- Luke 9:23
 - To take up your cross daily involves a consistent submission of His authority over your life
 - To take up one's cross daily involves being obedient to Christ and His reign over your life
 - C. The requirement that a disciple "take up his cross" means "to submit to the rule against which he was formerly in rebellion."- Michael Green
 - D. The consequences of taking up one's cross can include suffering for His name's sake-
 - Suffering for His name's sake often occurs in the life of one who pursues His highest purposes- 2 Timothy 3:10:12
 - Suffering for His name's sake occurs in a person whose life reflects a devotion to the gospel- Philippians 1:27-29

 Following Christ in His directions for our life expresses our love for Him- John 21:15-19

Takeaways:

- 1. Receiving Christ as Savior and walking with Christ as a growing disciple are both done on the basis of faith in Christ- Colossians 2:6-7
- 2. In this world we will have struggles that can make us aware that following Christ is the only way to face all we will face in this life- John 16:33
- 3. The disciple's walk is a life of opposites- you die to live, you give and yet you receive, you humble yourself, and He exalts you- Matthew 8:34-35; Luke 6:38; James 4:10
